There is nothing we do, have done or will do that can separate us from the love of God. God makes no exceptions, nor do we. Come join us in praise, prayer and the work of our Lord!

MARK-INGS

This morning's Bible study group (let me shamelessly advertise Tuesday 7:00 am, and it's not too om the Postor late to join!) has continued our journey through the Gospel of John. We were talking about John 14-16, and Jesus' promise of the Holy Spirit to His disciples as He was telling them that He would be leaving them soon. The Greek word is "parakletos", a word hard to translate. So our English versions have words such as 'teacher', 'advocate', and 'helper' as a stab at the meaning. I told the group that the Greek word literally means "to surround with a call". It gives the sense of a 360 degree voice, God's calling from every direction so that I have no auditory distractions. God is working so hard to be heard that God will surround me with God's voice.

Jesus is telling the disciples that they will not be alone. They will have Jesus' voice teaching them and instructing them and empowering them. They don't even have to fear being brought to trial. Our prayers "save us from the time of trial" include the understanding that Jesus will give us the words to speak at the right time, because Jesus can be heard.

Jesus was doing far more than giving an extended 'good bye'. He was really building the Church. Jesus was blessing those who had followed His signs and wonders and words with the promise of strength to move ahead after His departure. He promised that these students would do even greater things in His name. Like a high school teacher or college professor investing all their energy into teaching students with the hopes that the students will change the world with what they have learned, Jesus is pouring out Himself for these new leaders.

We will celebrate Ascension Day on Thursday, May 5th. Jesus will leave this earth, and those disciples will quickly have to figure out how to engage the teaching of Jesus with their world. We will celebrate Pentecost on May 15th. We will hear the story about how the Parakletos will blow on the disciples and give them words, even in unlearned languages, so that nothing will hinder the telling of the story of the death and resurrection of Jesus.

In John's Gospel, just after the promise of the Spirit and just before the observance of the Passover Festival on the night we now call Holy Thursday, there is a long prayer, the whole of John Chapter 17. Jesus prays for us. This month my prayer with Jesus for this church is that we hear His voice calling us and praying for us. I trust we hear the voice of the Spirit empowering us to tell our stories of faith. We invite others into this church that praises and serves and follows the crucified, risen and ascended Jesus. We say with profound love and joy the mystery of our faith: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. We say that in any and all circumstances.

We will be opening the Ulvilden Chapel as a house of prayer for people to hear the Parakletos. From 10 am - 2:00 pm Monday - Friday, we will have lights on and prayer book open. Please know that you can stop by to have a quiet spiritual place, to hear the Spirit of Jesus call and invite you, to remember others and yourself.

On May 15th at 11 am after the Sunday School party is over, I invite all who are on the prayer chain and anyone who wants to be part, of prayer work to come to the choir room. We will talk about how we might make our common prayer life a bigger part of this church.

Clarification regarding process for memorial fund transfers to cover expenses and payroll. **Motion (Losby/Staples) to approve Treasurer's report. Motion passed unanimously.**

 - ii) Offering for Synod assembly, in years past our congregation has sent an offering. Motion (Tisthammer/Staples) to approve \$250 from general unrestricted fund for Synod Assembly offering. Motion passed unanimously. An announcement will be put in Messenger and Bulletin regarding a special collection for Synod Assembly offering.

 - a) Audit Committee Review; at least three people are needed to participate in the Audit process. Hope is to have this scheduled by June 1.
 - b) Lutheran Social Services (LSS) has requested use of the former associate pastor's office. Attorney will be contacted to draft a contract between OSL and LSS to include a clause for an initial 90 day review. The contract for no-cost use by LSS will be for the length of one year. **Motion (Engan/Losby) to approve use of the associate pastor's office by LSS provided they agree to the terms within the contract. Motion passed unanimously.**

With the snow now gone, and the grass soon ready for mowing, planned projects held up by the frost can now proceed to completion. The marquee signs installed in the winter were able to be electrified during the week of April 18. The replacement of the protective parking lot post that had been pushed over while the concrete was still wet will proceed shortly. Replacement of the 6th Street steps on the west side of the church is scheduled to begin during the week of April 25. By the time this Messenger reaches you there may be jackhammers, joining the organ and choir in making music at Our Savior's (though probably not all at once).

Main Bathroom Renovation

The Capital Campaign Committee has met with Borton Construction to refine the plans for the main floor bathroom renovation. Work with their architect has led to a revised plan that will allow women's and men's handicap accessible bathrooms within the footprint of the existing bathrooms. This appears to save some costs compared to the earlier plan had involved moving a wall in the visitation pastor's office/library area. We are also having Borton develop plans to create movable barriers to restrict access to the sanctuary, chapel and basement in order to provide wheelchair access the new family restroom for Come to Supper while still having adequate fire exit access. We anticipate that this work will begin in late June and be completed during the summer.

Brightening the Worship Space

The lighting project in the nave of the church is being studied. Currently we are working with three local electrical contractors to develop proposals to brighten the lighting so that everyone can read the bulletin, not just those sitting under the lights (or with young eyes). Details will be shared with the congregation once they are available. This project will likely be scheduled in the fall of 2016 or winter of 2016-17.

Organ Re-Dedication


Now with a few months of "shakedown" of the new organ systems, plans are being developed for an organ rededication weekend in the fall. This will likely be in last September or early October.

Funding

As of March 31, 2016, with 14 months remaining in the 36 month campaign, 86.6% of the funds to reach the campaign's \$433,000 goal have now been received. With pledges awaiting fulfillment in the next 14 months, the campaign is at 101% of that goal. Thanks to all who have so generously committed to embracing the future of the Our Savior's ministry.



LWR Baby Care Kits

A Baby Care Kit from LWR is like a promise. It says to that baby, **Your needs will not be neglected by this world. You matter to us.** When you send a Baby Care Kit, you provide encouragement by welcoming these little ones into an international community that cares.

The Baby Care Kit instruction sheets will be available in the Narthex on Mother's Day, **Sunday May 8th**. The kits are due back on Rally Sunday, **September IIth**. Below is the list of items to include in each Baby Care Kit from the LWR website:

- Two lightweight cotton t-shirts
- Two long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- Two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, up to 52" square
- Four cloth diapers, flat fold preferred (see the Diaper Tip Sheet for alternatives (.pdf))
- One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- Two pairs of socks
- One hand towel, dark color recommended
- Two or three bath-size gentle bars of soap equaling up to 8-9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping
- Two diaper pins or large safety pins

Please include sizes between 6 and 24 months. Varying the sizes of the clothing items included will make the Baby Care Kit useful as the baby grows.

Sweaters may be knitted or crocheted from leftover yarn, or made from heavy double knits or fleece. Select a pattern that suits your skill level. Preferred styles have buttons or ties down the front.

Diapers can be made from flannel or even by recycling t-shirts.

If knitting or crocheting receiving blankets, including one knitted/crocheted blanket and one flannel blanket will provide maximum versatility.

Onesies can be cut and hemmed or serged to make a simple t-shirt.

Gowns, rompers or top/pants sets can be substituted for sleepers.
