Waking Up White is the book Debby Irving wishes someone had handed her decades ago. By sharing her

sometimes cringe-worthy struggle to understand racism and racial tensions, she offers a fresh perspective on bias, stereotypes, manners, and tolerance. As she unpacks her own long-held beliefs about colorblindness, being a good person, and wanting to help people of color, she reveals how each of these well-intentioned mindsets actually perpetuated her ill-conceived ideas about race. She also explains why and how she's changed the way she talks about racism, works in racially mixed groups, and understands the racial justice movement as a whole.

COME FOR SUPPER

Co-vid continues to impact our usual routine. This year we started preparing additional meals for those staying at Houska Park. We prepared 80-100 meals that were picked up and handed out at the park. When Houska Park was shut down due to the cold we discontinued those meals. A couple of weeks later we were asked to prepare meals for those individuals that had moved to the Econo Lodge. Currently we are preparing 110 meals weekly.

After those meals are prepared and packaged we start packaging meals for carry outs for individuals coming to the church. Numbers vary from week to week and average around 140. Individuals pick up meals for themselves, their family, or others to deliver.

At our Tuesday meal before Christmas we handed out bags that included many items. Some of the items were shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste, hand sanitizer, gloves, socks, and a blanket. Throughout the winter months we distribute winter coats and other winter items. If you are

looking at getting rid of any winter items, please consider dropping them off at the church and we will deliver to those in need.

It is certainly different from when we used to have guests come and eat in the fellowship hall but we are adapting. We have a very dedicated group of individuals who help every Tuesday and deserve a great deal of thanks! We will continue different ways for our guests to Come For Supper!

WOMEN'S CLOTHES CLOSET (WCC)

Did you know?

- The Lion's Club donates reading glasses to the WCC! This is popular with our clients.
- Several area businesses held clothing drives for the WCC this year. The list includes but is not limited to Trust Point, YMCA, New Horizons, and Lily of the Valley.
- Portland Lutheran WELCA, Cashton, donated over a dozen beautiful quilts.

Despite the ongoing challenges of COVID 19, the WCC has adjusted to ensure the safety and health of our staff and clients and continues to serve women in need in our community.

- From January through November, the WCC has served 559 clients, of which, 43 are new.
- The WCC has received 225 donations of clothing and other items. Those we are unable to use are repurposed to other organizations.
