A Study for Lent 2023 "Church & State" Written and Led by Pastor Joanne Richmond

This discussion-based, synod-wide study takes place Sunday evenings in Lent, February 26—March 26 (6:30 – 7:30 P.M.) using ZOOM. You can register for the course by contacting the synod office 608-788-5000 or by using email office@lacrosseareasynod.org.

Each session addresses a specific topic relevant to the relationship between faith and nation, as lived by Lutherans in the United States. This relationship between faith and nation, church and state, exists in each of us while simultaneously being lived "out" in our daily lives. Current societal pressures, coming from all facets of political and religious life, confuse our thinking about faith and nation, church and state.

The purpose of this study: to engage in conversations about citizenship in the context of Lutheran thought, most specifically a Lutheran understanding of baptism, with the hope of relieving any confusion we experience as we live as baptized children of God.

Session One: Back to Basics (Church) - February 26th

According to Lutheran belief, what does it means to be a baptized child of God?

Grounding the conversation: "The Sacrament of Holy Baptism" from The Small Catechism.

Session Two: Back to Basics (State) - March 5

According to the constitution of the United States, what does it mean to be a citizen?

Grounding the conversation: the 14th amendment to the constitution.

Session Three: Church & State - March 12

What does it mean to be a person of faith in a nation that protects the free exercise of religion?

Grounding the conversation: The 1st amendment to the constitution AND the 2nd petition of the Lord's Prayer as explained in the Small Catechism

Session Four: Current State of Affairs - March 19

Christian Nationalism: what does it mean?

Grounding the conversation: a 27-minute video produced by CBS news "The Right's Fight to Make America a Christian Nation"

Session Five: What does this mean? - March 26

The threads of previous weeks' conversations will be woven together.

Grounding the conversation: Christians Against Christian Nationalism Statement.
