## **CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS**

Friends in Christ, in this Lenten season we have heard our Lord's call to struggle against sin, death, and the devil—all that keeps us from loving God and each other. This is the struggle to which we were called at baptism.

Within the community of the church, God never wearies of forgiving sin and giving the peace of reconciliation. On this night let us confess our sin against God and our neighbor, and enter the celebration of the great Three Days reconciled with God and with one another.

#### Most merciful God,

we confess that we are captive to sin and cannot free ourselves. We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. For the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name.

### Amen.

God, who is rich in mercy, loved us even when we were dead in sin, and made us alive together with Christ. By grace you have been saved. In the name of + Jesus Christ, your sins are forgiven. Almighty God strengthen you with power through the Holy Spirit, that Christ may live in your hearts through faith.

## PRAYER OF THE DAY


Holy God, source of all love, on the night of his betrayal,

## THANKSGIVING AT THE TABLE

God most mighty, God most merciful, God our rock and our salvation, hear us as we praise, call us to your table, grant us your life. When the earth was a formless void, you formed order and beauty. When Abraham and Sarah were barren, you sent them a child; When the Israelites were enslaved, you led them to freedom. Ruth faced starvation, David fought Goliath, and the psalmists cried out for healing, and full of compassion, you granted the people your life.

You entered our sorrows in Jesus our brother. He was born among the poor, he lived under oppression, he wept over the city. With infinite love, he granted people life.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Remembering his death, we cry out Amen. **Amen.** 

Celebrating his resurrection, we shout Amen. **Amen.** 

Trusting his presence in every time and place, we plead Amen. **Amen.** 

God, you are Breath: send your Spirit on this meal. God, you are Bread: feed us with yourself. God, you are Wine: warm our hearts and make us one. God, you are Fire: transform us with hope. God most majestic, O God most motherly, God our strength and our song, you show us a vision of a tree of life with fruits for all and leaves that heal the nations.

Grant us such life, the life of the Father to the Son, the life of the Spirit of our risen Savior, life in you, now and forever. **Amen.**

## STRIPPING OF THE ALTAR—Portions of Psalm 22


(The congregation reads as pastors strip the altar)

<sup>1</sup>My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning? <sup>2</sup>O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night but find no rest. <sup>3</sup>Yet vou are holv, enthroned on the praises of Israel. <sup>4</sup> In you our ancestors trusted; they trusted, and you delivered them. <sup>5</sup>To you they cried and were saved; in you they trusted and were not put to shame. <sup>6</sup> But I am a worm and not human, scorned by others and despised by the people. <sup>7</sup>All who see me mock me; they sneer at me; they shake their heads... <sup>9</sup>Yet it was you who took me from the womb; you kept me safe on my mother's breast. <sup>10</sup> On you I was cast from my birth, and since my mother bore me you have been my God. <sup>11</sup> Do not be far from me. for trouble is near, and there is no one to help. <sup>14</sup> I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint; my heart is like wax; it is melted within my breast: <sup>15</sup> my mouth is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to my jaws; you lay me in the dust of death. <sup>17</sup> I can count all my bones. They stare and gloat over me; <sup>18</sup> they divide my clothes among themselves, and for my clothing they cast lots. <sup>19</sup> But you, O LORD, do not be far away! O my help, come quickly to my aid! <sup>20</sup> Deliver my soul...

<sup>27</sup> All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD, and all the families of the nations shall worship before him. <sup>28</sup> For dominion belongs to the LORD, and he rules over the nations.

## **CHURCH OFFICE CLOSED**


Please note that the church office will be closed, Monday, April 21, 2025 in observance of Easter. The church office will reopen on Tuesday, April 22 at 9am.
